

This animation was inspired by a poster called 'The Life of Humans' created by Fritz Kahn in 1926. Kahn portrayed humans as the ultimate machine during the **industrial age** (a period in time from the late 18th century to the early 20th century when lots of machines were being invented to do the work people used to do by hand). He likened the body's functions to **industrial processes** (the way we make things in big factories using machines and technology) and office scenarios, making complex biological and physical processes easier to grasp for everyone.



'For these people, the sex they were born with doesn't match the gender they feel they are.'

'This is about the physical characteristics you are born with, like whether you have XX or XY chromosomes. Most babies are born with one of these, but some are born with variations.'

'This is about the things society thinks boys and girls should do or like. Like, some people think only boys can like football, and only girls can like dolls. But it's not just about toys or colours. It's also about things like how boys and girls sit or the jobs they choose when they grow up. For instance, some people might think only men can be builders, and only women can be nurses.'

'A term for everyone who does not see themselves as always straight.'

'Drag Kings and Drag Queens are performers who dress up as the opposite gender for shows. It's like a fun play where someone might dress as a man if they're a woman, or vice versa. But it's not just for laughs! They also want to show that gender rules can be silly and need questioning. So, while it's entertaining, it's also a way to think about how we see boys and girls.'
